WHAT IS AN "INDUSTRY PRACTITIONER"?

An "Industry Practitioner" is any individual and/or entity delivering services in the community titles sector. These services can be practical, technical, auditing or advisory in nature. "Industry Practitioners" simply practice in our industry. Our "industry" is the community titles sector - particularly focussing on maintenance and repairs of plant, equipment, infrastructure and building elements contained within the common property of Bodies Corporate or Strata schemes.

WHAT QUALIFICATIONS DOES AN "INDUSTRY PRACTITIONER" NEED?

Relevant qualifications vary from role-to-role. For example, technical service providers and trade contractors require trade-related licenses, tickets and induction certificates. Lawyers require university degrees and practicing licenses. Letting agents require letting licenses. Some industry practitioners, however, require no qualification at all, such as caretakers, building managers and compliance consultants. This is where the ABMA is focussed. Where formal qualifications did not exist previously, the ABMA has developed skills recognition programs. The ABMA does not deliver any form of consulting or building management services, however, via its register of Accredited Industry Practitioners it does refer business to service providers that have completed the ABMA Accreditation program.
